I use "Your Baby Can Read" with my 2 1/2 year old and she loves it! She asks to watch the 'baby movie'. As an Early childhood Educator, I am excited about "Your Baby Can Read." I look at this program as a way to give any child a head start. Any parent can use this program. A child from any racial or social class can experience success with YBCR. Even struggling readers in K-2 can benefit from these DVDs.

Research shows that children who enter Kindergarten ready to learn have a higher success than those who are not prepared. Research has also shown children must achieve a certain level of reading by 3rd grade to ensure academic success. The reading levels of second graders can determine how many jails a county may need. With this in mind, it does not take a lot of convincing to understand how important reading is.

Some parents at first glance may think that they would be pressuring their child into learning before they are ready. Babies are born to learn. With the latest research, we now know what preschool teachers have known all along, a great deal of a child's capability to learn has already developed by age five. It's all about input, the greater the input is at this stage of development the greater the output is at a later stage of development.

Giving a child what they need to succeed is not pressure. Pressure is when a child can't function at a level that is expected and learning is not fun because it is a struggle. All parents want their children to succeed. They just need tools to help them accomplish this and I believe that Your Baby Can Read! can be that tool!

I have an amazing story about my daughter, Camerin. I followed your instructions on how to view the video. I have to admit, I was a bit skeptical in the beginning.
